#### IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN

There are rhythms to human life: daily rhythms, weekly rhythms, annual rhythms. With regard to annual rhythms, we are about to enter our annual week of disruption, excitement, angst, and celebration that comes around every year. And I am not talking about Masters Week, although the same adjectives are applicable. Rather, I am speaking of Holy Week. From the late third Century, Christians have set aside a week of special observances related to the last days of Jesus' earthly life and the salvation opened to us because of those events. This is the holiest time of the Christian year. Christmas is important, Pentecost is important, but nothing in our Christian faith rises to anywhere near the significance of the events of Holy Week from Palm Sunday to Maundy Thursday, to Good Friday, and finally to Easter. There is no meaning to the Christian faith without the events observed in Holy Week.

I suspect for many of us, there is a little voice in our heads that we like to pretend doesn't exist, and that voice says "But it is also Masters Week this year." Unfortunately, that is true. Good Shepherd tried years ago to get the Augusta National to avoid having the tournament during Holy Week, but we all know how that turned out. So here we have it: the secular and our religious rhythms collide. What can we do?

First and foremost, we cannot pretend that secular rhythms are not present in our lives. We are "in the world" even if, as Christians, we are not "of the world." Masters Week is upon us, and it affects the lives of most of us in Augusta. I would like to pretend otherwise, but that would be delusional, and delusional is not a good place to be. However, for those remaining in Augusta next week, we at Good Shepherd will be doing our best to make observing Holy Week's great days accessible even as Masters Week goes on. Please see our schedule elsewhere in The Shepherd's Fold. For those traveling, there is likely to be a church with Holy Week services wherever you are going that you can attend.

Regardless of whether you will be in town or out of town next, my prayer for you is that you may have a blessed Holy Week culminating in a joyous Easter.


