The Fourth Sunday of Easter

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

In the Christian tradition, a patronal feast is a celebration of the feast day of the patron for which a church is named, i.e. its patron saint. In Darien I had the pleasure of two patronal feasts each year: the feast days for St. Andrew and for St. Cyprian. These were great days of celebration. So what about our beloved Good Shepherd? Our parish is not named for somebody with the title "Saint;" so do we have a patronal feast? Absolutely, because we have the greatest patron of them all: the Good Shepherd himself, Jesus. "I am the good shepherd" Jesus said to the Pharisees. (John 10.11) This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday, our patronal feast, because the lectionary provides that we read part of the "Good Shepherd Discourse" on the fourth Sunday in Easter every year. While growing up at Good Shepherd, any mention of Jesus as the Good Shepherd would immediately bring to my mind the image of our altar window. I would see Jesus as this kindly figure lovingly holding the little lamb while the adult sheep and doves look on. What a beautiful and heartwarming picture, and an appropriate vision of our loving Savior. As I have gotten older and learned more about the reality of first century Palestine, I now see an additional image. In Jesus' day, a shepherd would not likely be the richly robed figure we see in our altar window, but rather a man roughly dressed as befitting one of the lowliest and least desirable occupations available. A shepherd was one who worked in the dust and dirt of the fields, who faced hazards from predators, both human and animal, who lived more with the unwashed animals than with people. Yet, as Jesus reminds us, the shepherd loves the sheep and will give his life for the sheep, a beautiful but very different picture, a picture that has at its center the cross. As we celebrate our patronal feast, Good Shepherd Sunday, we should keep in mind both images of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. We have the image of our loving savior from the altar window along with the image of the lowly, despised shepherd giving his life for his sheep-for us. The first image should strengthen us to follow Jesus as our shepherd while the second image tells us to follow Jesus into the broken, dangerous, oftentimes dirty world to love our neighbors, who are just as much a part of Jesus' flock as we are. As a Christian, there is no more fitting place to be than in a church whose patron is the Good Shepherd

Until then, we will have to be patient with this unsightly problem.

The vestry has approved a committee composed of master gardeners, a parishioner with landscape architecture training, other avid gardeners, and the Junior Warden, which committee has been weighing different proposals for how we should handle our grounds. We certainly understand the frustration of many about the state of the grounds right now, but please know that the committee is diligently working to make the right decision for the long-term benefit of Good Shepherd.
