

# WHAT DOES THE LORD REQUIRE OF YOU BUT TO DO JUSTICE, AND TO LOVE KINDNESS, AND TO WALK HUMBLY WITH YOUR GOD?

Micah 6:8

Every year after the summer break, as Good Shepherd resumes full services and programs, the staff and clergy discern a new theme, logo or scripture passage that clearly states what we as a community will be about during the coming year.

The Episcopal Day School does the same thing, so usually there are two scriptural beacons that guide Good Shepherd and EDS. This year EDS came up with the Micah verse that is the title of this little article. The Good Shepherd staff and clergy so resonated with this scripture that we asked EDS to let us join them with this single statement of purpose. EDS happily agreed!

Since the prophet Micah is probably not a household name, I'm writing to briefly introduce you all to him, and to give a sense of the circumstances that prompted him to pen those words. Micah is considered one of the minor prophets ("minor" prophets means that they wrote relatively short books). He was a contemporary of Isaiah, Amos, and Hosea and did most of his prophesy and writing between 737 BC and 696 BC.

Micah's messages and prophecies were directed toward Jerusalem. He was not happy with the dishonest business practices, which impoverished the city's citizens. He was the first prophet to predict the downfall and destruction of Jerusalem. Micah was a fierce champion of pure worship of the Lord and of social justice.

Micah also rebuked Israel because of dishonesty in the marketplace and corruption in government. He warned the people, on behalf of God, of pending destruction if ways and hearts were not changed. He told them that they could get out of their mess if they only did what the Lord required of them (Micah 6:8 KJV):

He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?

From reading Micah it seems that Jerusalem, Judah, and Israel in the 6th and 7th centuries BC had the same problems the world has in 2023 AD. Micah offers the remedy. Do justice, Love Kindness, Walk humbly.

I'm not sure we can convince the world that this is a good idea, but we sure can practice it at 2230 and 2248 Walton Way!
