## THERE, BUT BY THE GRACE OF GOD, GO I

We modern Americans are fascinated by disasters, especially natural disasters. The media is aware of this and will go to wall-to-wall coverage whenever a disaster strikes. The fires in Maui and the storm in California are just the most recent examples. If you have any question about this aspect of our human nature, you need only look at the ratings for The Weather Channel whenever there is a hurricane. Hurricanes are particularly good subjects for the media because you can have two days of coverage anticipating the landfall, a day of the actual storm hitting the US, and days of coverage of the damage. What is amazing is that people all over the country tune in even though hurricanes are not a danger for them. Watching the disasters affecting others almost becomes a spectator sport; we live vicariously through the troubles of others without having to be exposed to any risk ourselves.

The irony of our fascination with disasters is that most of us live as if we are somehow magically immune from disasters, which of course we are not. We believe that they are something that happens to other people, and we operate on the assumption that we are in such control of our lives that all will be well. Of course, such an assumption is patently false. Even if we do not live in an area of likely hurricanes, fires, etc. (as we are fortunate to do so in Augusta), there is alway the random lightning strike, cancer diagnosis, or some other misfortune that can come our way no matter how much we prepare. Yes, we can improve our odds of avoiding calamities with prudence, but 100% protection is unattainable.

So how are we to live our lives? First, we need to give thanks to God to the extent we have avoided disaster. Then, if trouble does strike, we need to remember that God is with us even in our struggles. As Jesus told his disciples before his ascension; "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28.20) Finally, we need to help bear the burdens of those who are currently suffering. That is the mission of Episcopal Relief and Development, which currently is engaged in getting relief to the victims of the Maui fires.

As Joe so often reminds us, "life is short." So, let us be grateful for the blessings we have received and be a blessing for those who are suffering misfortune. For there, but by the grace of God, go I.
