THE END OF SUMMER?

At Good Shepherd, summer is much more relaxed than the program year. We have fewer services, less formal Christian education, less EDS functions, etc. It is a really pleasant time of year for your church staff. But just like summers as a child, the end of summer is also the beginning of something new and good.
