The First Sunday of Advent

NOW THANK WE ALL OUR GOD!

The words, "Nun danket alle Gott..." are from Martin Rinckart, a 17th century Christian. They were set to music by Johann Cruger, and the hymn has been used ever since that time to celebrate the power and wonder of God's unending presence and love. It is a powerful hymn when sung from the heart. However, in order to do that the human soul must do an enormous amount of recalling and remembering; contrasting the experiences of life so that we really know why we are to be thankful. If one has never been hungry then how can hunger be understood? Death remains a vague but far away concept, unless the heart has been ripped apart by loss.

This blessed season wears a heavy veneer of blessing, joy, family, and wholeness and all of that is as it should be, but is not perceived that way by some fellow travelers. Thanksgiving, Advent, New Year's are all periods in time which wounded souls are grappling with facing these seasons without a familiar loved one, or feeling broken by divorce, or perhaps numbed by the loss of a much needed job.

What are we to do? We do what the church does best: we pray, worship, and remember. The power of Jesus Christ manifested by the Holy Spirit can use a community to turn emptiness into fullness, grief into a gentle acceptance, and darkness into light. It becomes possible to smile and to cry at the same time.

An opportunity for healing presents itself on **December 4**, at 6 p.m. with our annual Light in the Darkness Service for those for whom the holidays might be a bit rough. Fr. Andy will be leading the service. He invites you to bring a small picture of a loved one who has joined the saints in glory. Mitzi McCoy will be down at the altar to receive those photos and she will place them on the altar for you.

As a priest, I would be derelict it duty if I did not say to one and all, "Rejoice! Be proactive. The God of Light and Life wants to meet you face to face and push back the shadow."
