Last Sunday after the Epiphany

LET THERE BE LIGHT!

And God said, "Let there be light" and there was light. God saw that it was good and he separated the light from the darkness. (Genesis 1:3) These are the very first words that God spoke on that first day of creation. I have often thought that since light has to have a source and God did not create the sun and the moon until the fourth day, then in the beginning God must have been the light. I get comfort from that perspective since in the long Biblical story, Jesus eventually becomes the light that nurtures and saves us.

If you have gone to any Christian church, it does not really matter which denomination, you will hear the word light several times during a given service. In the NRSV Bible light is referenced 236 times! With all these references to light in the Old and New Testaments, it is quite evident that this is major metaphor that runs a bright thread throughout the Bible.

It is well that for the past three weeks light has been the theme for WAGS, presented in music, art, and scripture. It is also well that this Sunday, the last Sunday in Epiphany, we relive the story of the Transfiguration. That divine moment is witnessed by only three - Peter, James, and John - who see first-hand heaven and earth coming together. Their response, their very human response, is to hold on to that moment, build three tents and stay there.


I feel sorry for those three disciples – they missed a great opportunity. I feel sorry for myself when I miss those personal divine moments and am unable to drop my humanity just to be in that moment in wonder and awe as God reveals Himself.

Perhaps the folks who crafted our lectionary put the Transfiguration story before Lent, so maybe, just maybe, we would drop our human reactions and embrace the wonder and awe of God as a preparation for the forty days that lie ahead.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY


Our next COGS volunteer project will


