### YOU DON'T KNOW WHAT YOU'VE GOT UNTIL IT'S GONE

"You don't know what you've got until it's gone." As I am drifting into my 80's, this line from Joni Mitchell's 1970 hit song, *Big Yellow Taxi* pops into my head more often than I would like. The truth of the matter is that for most of us aging brings various degrees of unraveling of our bodies. The poignant scripture from John 21:18 sums this up, "The truth is, when you were young, you tied your own belt and went where you wanted. But when you are old, you will put out your hands, and someone else will tie your belt. They will lead you where you don't want to go."

We all want to postpone physical loss as long as possible. We all want to age "gracefully." Now there is no shortage of web sites that will tell you exactly how to do that. Their advice is usually accompanied by some anti-aging product that is guaranteed to make you live longer.

Research has shown that walking carries the most long-term health benefits. Actually, just some sort of moving every day is helpful. The legendary Satchel Paige, who could have pitched in the big leagues well into his 60's, once made this observation, "Keep moving and don't look back. Something may be gaining on you!"

What I'm saying is "use it or lose it!" All of these things about physical loss can be said about loss of faith. Frederick Buechner writes that faith is better understood as a verb rather than a noun, as a process rather than a possession. Looking at faith as a verb and a process opens up a whole new world. Faith as a verb implies that it, like our bodies, must be fed properly and must be exercised to reach its full potential.

The obvious exercises are attending and engaging church, regular Bible study with friends, regular prayer, and generous giving, but wouldn't it be fun to just let our imaginations guide our "faith exercises?"

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

We have closed out the books for 2023, and our fiscal year ended with a surplus of \$24,971, even after we replaced the large flat roof on the parish house and all of the HVAC units on that roof. Thank you for your generosity! 20% of our budget supports outreach in Augusta and in the wider community, and 23% supports our program ministry, which includes Christian formation for youth and children.
