#### A FUTURE SO BRIGHT

Earlier this month, our vestry met in retreat at Kanuga. It was a productive time that fills me with great optimism for Good Shepherd. With me being a "short-timer," I was anxious to see how this vestry would engage with the task of leading our congregation. Without any question, I see a very bright future.

Both wardens and ten of our twelve vestry members were present. The vestry represented the diversity at Good Shepherd. We had the older and the younger, lifetime Episcopalians and those new to the church, male and female, persons on different ends of the theological spectrum, persons of significantly different economic circumstances. Each person genuinely listened to and valued the contributions of others.

Our work sessions focused on three areas: the transition process for our new rector, an analysis of the state of the parish, and a business meeting focused on our financial expectations and budget for the coming year. Right from the start, all were engaged. Everyone expressed a genuinely positive outlook. There was great honesty in discussing some potentially difficult topics, which demonstrated an extraordinary amount of mutual trust.

As is the tradition at Good Shepherd's vestry retreats, there was ample time for socializing and team building. Even when there was a late night heated discussion about non-church issues (amazingly also not about politics!), the camaraderie was amazing. Our vestry is truly a cohesive team that has the good of the parish in mind rather than individual interests.

The transition to a new rector is a critical time in the life of a parish, especially when the prior rector had served for 37 years. Accordingly, the leadership of the vestry is needed more now than at any other time. I am convinced that this vestry is up to the task. The future of Good Shepherd is truly bright.

### SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Search Committee is delighted to report that we have received nine applications from candidates interested in our Rector position. We have started the process of reviewing each application. We expect to conduct our initial interviews with these candidates over the next few weeks. After those interviews are completed, it is our hope to narrow the field to a

small group of finalists. We will keep you informed as we move forward. Please continue to pray for our church and the Search Committee as we begin this exciting next phase of our search.

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

We have closed out the books for 2023, and our fiscal year ended with a surplus of \$24,971, even after we replaced the large flat roof on the parish house and all of the HVAC units on that roof. Thank you for your generosity! 20% of our budget supports outreach in Augusta and in the wider community, and 23% supports our program ministry, which includes Christian formation for youth and children.
