ONE NATION UNDER GOD

When I was in school from first grade through my senior year at Richmond Academy, each day began with The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and the Lord's Prayer. With hands over our hearts, we began each day reminded of the fact that we, the many, were one under the one flag. And then we prayed the prayer that Jesus taught us.

The original Pledge was written by Francis Bellamy in 1892. The original version went like this, "I pledge allegiance to my Flag and the Republic, for which it stands, one nation, indivisible with liberty and justice for all." Bellamy's thought in using the word my was that any nation could use his pledge. In 1923 my flag was changed to the flag and in 1924 of America was added. In 1954, communism was a looming threat. So, President Eisenhower urged Congress to add under God to the Pledge of Allegiance. When it was passed into law, he stated, "we are reaffirming the transcendence of religious faith in America's heritage and future; in this way we shall constantly strengthen those spiritual weapons which forever will be our country's most powerful resource, in peace or in war." The words, "under God", do they still resonate? Do we believe, like Eisenhower, that they remind us of the "spiritual weapons which forever will be our country's most powerful resource, in peace or in war."

Pray that his almighty hand will continue to guide us, that we will follow his word as our law, and make his path our chosen way.
