### HARD WINTERS/FALSE SPRINGS

Although the average temperature this winter has not been out of the ordinary, we gardeners will say this was a hard winter because of the Christmas Eve freeze. For two days, we had freezing the likes of which we have not seen in over 30 years. Plants that ordinarily handle our winters were hurt and in some cases killed, and we probably will not truly know the complete toll until this summer. To make matters possibly worse, the mild weather for the past six weeks has caused many of our azaleas and other flowering plants to bloom two weeks earlier than normal. Is this a false spring that will end with a late freeze that kills much of Augusta's spring beauty? I pray that this will not occur, but it is a definite possibility.

Hard winters and false springs apply to more than just the weather. Our personal lives are subject to hard winters. False springs occur when everything seems to be getting better and then another blow falls. It is the old two steps forward and one step back. Hard winters and false springs in our lives are difficult to take. They easily make a pessimist out of an optimist. As Ray Charles sang: "If it weren't for bad luck, I'd have no luck at all." As a priest, I have had to sit with many people who could add poignant verses to that song.

So how do we live with this reality? As Christians, we know that Easter always, always, always follows Good Friday. While things will often not work out as we like in this life, God is with us in our struggles. Our job is to cling to that hope in the dark times of winter. When the going gets better, we must not get too excited because it may be a false spring and further trouble may be down the road. Yet we can be confident in the coming of the true spring that will be the abundant life in the arms of our loving God.


