SPRING CLEANING

It's that time of year again. Spring almost. And that means it's time for the deep clean. Heavy work. Spring is also a time to declutter. A time to finally admit that you will never again fit into your college jeans and then forcing yourself to toss them into the donation bin.

We used to rent our house for Masters. So, spring cleaning became more urgent. There was a deadline. Each year my housekeeper, Sarah, and I would work ourselves into a frenzy getting the house ready for guests. The months of February and March were consumed with washing the windows, polishing the chandeliers, moving the furniture, vacuuming and rolling back the rugs, mopping the hardwood floors, wiping down the base boards and crown molding, pressure washing. Each year it was the same story, and it was overwhelming. And then somebody suggested something that changed my life and Sarah's, too. Instead of doing one huge cleaning every year, take one room each week and deep clean it rotating rooms throughout the house. That way the rooms were deep cleaned more often, and it was much less stressful. It was a great idea that made life much easier.

I think that we could practice this same type of deep cleaning in our spiritual homes as well. Many of us use Lent as our time to spring clean our hearts, souls, and minds. Once a year to look back over our lives. Once a year to commit to doing better. Once a year to be more spiritually disciplined. Once a year to commit to daily Bible reading, zooming Morning Prayer, or attending the Healing Service. Once a year to promise to attend to our faith and our relationship with God. But for just the six weeks of Lent. What about the other 46 weeks of the year? We use that six weeks of Lent like Sarah and I were using February and March for spring cleaning.

I think that we might be more aware of our shortcomings and our need for God in our lives if we made spiritual cleaning a weekly (or, better yet, a daily) practice to examine our thoughts, our words, our deeds. If we made personal reflection a weekly or daily commitment, we might be surprised how our lives might change for the better. We could cleanse our souls of our hurtful words and our slights toward others. We could declutter our hardened hearts of the resentment we feel toward some.

Simon and I have often spoken of how great it felt to come back home after the renters had left. The house felt so clean, so peaceful. There was nothing to do that night but enjoy the beauty and comfort of our home. And that same peace and comfort could be felt in our spiritual home if we would just pay attention to it throughout the entire year.
