THE WEEK OF WEEKS

"Are we there yet?" Yes we are! Palm Sunday, the beginning of the "Week of Weeks," is less than two days away. On that day we will recreate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem – he is loved by all. The tone of that story turns ugly as "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" becomes "Crucify him!"

Coming from a non-liturgical church background, I joined Good Shepherd nearly fifty years ago. I don't recall much emphasis put on Holy Week at those other churches, but at Good Shepherd, under the leadership of Father Allen Clarkson, there were services every day during Holy Week – Father Clarkson expected significant attendance those days! I confess I did not live up to his expectations until I was in the process for Holy Orders. I then came to realize the spiritual force of Holy Week. I came to realize that the power of Easter depends on all the events leading up to that "Day of Days!"

Holy Week invites us, along with Jesus to turn our face to Jerusalem. Holy Week invites us to take every step that Jesus took on his way to Golgotha. Holy Week invites us to experience in some way the reality of Jesus' intense physical, mental, and emotional suffering.

If you cannot attend the early week services, please read the Gospels for those days. Monday: John 12:1-11, Tuesday: John 12:20-36, and Wednesday: John 13:21-32.

I strongly recommend to you all the Maundy Thursday service. I invite you to personally experience the Foot Washing ceremony. If you do that, Jesus' words at the end of his washing the disciples feet will have a new meaning, "Love one another as I have loved you."

There will be two services on Good Friday, the day that Jesus suffered and died. I will be preaching. I will not sugarcoat the despicable things that were done to Jesus!

The final day of Holy Week, Holy Saturday, remembers Jesus' followers holding a vigil for him outside of his tomb. This vigil, in several different forms, has been practiced since the early second century.

Since the point of this little communication has been on Holy Week, I will say only this about Easter Sunday. If you are able to immerse yourself in Holy Week then the first day of the week, the "Day of Days," the hinge pin of our faith and beliefs will have a deeper significance for you.
