TAKE MY HAND

My friend, Ralph Kitchens, recently brought me the book, Soul Fuel, by Bear Grylls. (Thank you, Ralph. I'm loving it!) If you have boys of any age in your home, you most likely have seen one of his television shows, Man vs Wild or Running Wild. He was one of the youngest men to climb Mt. Everest and once crossed the Arctic Ocean in an inflatable boat. I'm pretty sure that you would call Bear Grylls an adventurer. This guy faces fear all the time. Granted, he places himself in these hair-raising situations, but whether self-inflicted (or self-prescribed depending upon your point of view) he still experiences the physical, emotional, spiritual, and psychological effects of fear.

Many of us are facing fear right now. It might be as simple as fear of the dark or fear that there is a monster that lives under the bed. But it is often more complicated. Fear of failure at a new job. Fear as we face learning a diagnosis. Fear of the side effects of treatment necessary to sustain life. Fear of facing life alone after losing someone we love. Fear of death. Fear of the unknown in life. Fear to make a decision that must be made. The list goes on.

Unlike Bear, who faces those self-inflicted fears, we most often face fears not of our own making. Now, we can run from those fears. We can wallow in those fears. Or we can face our fears as Bear does ... emboldened. Yes, emboldened by the power of prayer. He says that he never goes into a fear filled situation alone. To face fear, he explains, we must put our hand in the hand of God. Great fathers take their children by the hand. And God, our Father, is there to take us by the hand. He warns that holding onto our fears only allows them to flourish. Taking them to God diminishes their power over us. And when you take your fears to God, remember his promise to us, "for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9b).

So, whatever your fear, remember that God is with you.

God the Father to hold your hand and protect you.

God the Son to comfort you and give you peace.

God the Holy Spirit to guide you and give you strength to keep on keeping on...
