GIVING THANKS

We are now heading into Thanksgiving Week (our secular culture now focuses on more than just Thanksgiving Day), so it is appropriate to reflect on the meaning behind this celebration. The modern observance of Thanksgiving is the result of many historical twists and turns, but there is no dispute that events of the first year of the Massachusetts Bay Colony are at the heart of its development. Those colonists are remembered for giving thanks to God and their Native American neighbors for their survival of their first brutal year (especially the winter) in the New World. Thus, the observance has always been about gratitude for blessings received.

We continue to celebrate Thanksgiving in our country because we continue to receive blessings from God. As human beings, we are blessed beyond all measure by God's gift of God's son, Jesus, for our salvation. As Americans, we are further blessed by our freedoms in this great country. From a material standpoint, most of us at Good Shepherd are blessed beyond the wildest dreams of those early colonists: adequate security, food, clothing, shelter, and a standard of living that is the envy of the world. So it is meet and right that we should gather to give thanks for our many blessings, which we do every Sunday as we gather for the Eucharist, which is a Greek word for thanksgiving. Thanksgiving, as a national holiday, is the particular time when we as a nation express our gratitude for the blessings we have received as Americans.

So how do we express gratitude to God? What can we give to God that does not already belong to God? The answer is love, our love. That is what God desires of us: to love God with all of our heart, mind, soul, and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves. Sadly, our modern secular holiday of Thanksgiving has become, for most, a feast of self-indulgence (and don't get me started on Black Friday). So, as we gather with family and friends in the coming week, let us take time to show our love of God and neighbor. Worship on Thursday at 10:00 AM is a good start for loving God. Finding ways to share our material blessings with the less fortunate is a good way to express our love of neighbor. Whatever we choose to do for Thanksgiving, we should make sure that it expresses in love our thankfulness for God's blessings.
