Last Sunday after Pentecost: The Christ King

#### **NESTING**

If you have ever had a baby or been around a woman who is moving closer to delivery, you are familiar with the term nesting. It is the uncontrollable urge to prepare your home for the arrival of your new little one. Nesting comes in many forms. For most women it involves cleaning and organizing. Deep cleaning the entire house. Taking everything out of cabinets and closets, then refolding and rearranging. In the nursery that awaits the arrival of its new little occupant, there might be painting. Or just the wiping down of the walls, crown molding, and baseboards. The rug lifted, the floors swept and mopped. The curtains dry cleaned or laundered. New linens on the crib and the bassinette, and a new stuffed animal for the crib. And all of the baby's tiny little outfits washed in Ivory Snow, pressed, and folded.

I imagine that Mary used those last few weeks making ready for her soon to be newborn. We, too, can use these last few weeks before Christmas as a time for nesting. A time for preparing ourselves for the birth of Jesus. Actually, that is the purpose for the season of Advent. This first season of the church year, Advent, begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and continues through Christmas Eve. The season of Advent is "a time of preparation and expectation for the coming celebration of our Lord's nativity, and for the final coming of Christ 'in power and glory'." (Armentrout, An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church, 3).

Use the season of Advent wisely this year. Dust off the walls of your heart by forgiving those with whom you have quarreled. Paint over old hurts so that they can be let go. Dust off your Bible and read the Gospel of Mark, the featured Gospel for the coming year. Spend time in prayer. Don't get so caught up in the "busyness" and distraction of "secular Christmas" that you ignore the purpose of Advent. The season of Advent begins on December 3 this year. Mark your calendar. Begin your nesting on that day so that you will be prepared for the birth of Christ the King.
