MEMBERSHIP

I am frequently asked as to how one can become a member of Good Shepherd. I sense in the question some fear of an onerous process, denominations that require years of preparation or denominations that require a vote of the congregation to accept a new member. I am always happy to say that the Episcopal Church has only two requirements: having been baptized in a Christian church and asking to be a member. It is that simple. In the Episcopal Church we recognize that becoming a disciple of Jesus will always be a lifetime endeavor, so we welcome all at whatever stage they may be in that journey; we only ask that the person have been baptized (which we will offer to do if they have not.)

In order to participate fully in all aspects of the life of the church, there are a few additional requirements. For example, to vote at the annual meeting one must be a "member in good standing." To be "good standing," the canons of the church require that the person receive communion at least three times a year and be faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God. In addition, while not required for membership, it is the norm in the Episcopal Church for adult members to have been confirmed or received by the bishop. Confirmation is for those baptized as infants or children and who are now ready to make a mature affirmation of faith. Reception is for those who have previously made a mature affirmation of faith in another denomination but who are now joining the Episcopal Church. Members are confirmed or received by the bishop during his annual visitation where he will pray over them and lay hands on their heads. Having been confirmed or received is only required for those serving on the vestry and or serving as Eucharistic ministers (think layreaders).

For those who have come to Good Shepherd from other denominations and are interested in being confirmed or received, our bishop will be with us on **Sunday**, **November 12**. In preparation for confirmation and reception, the clergy will be leading a class on **Sunday mornings at 10:15 beginning on September 24** to discuss our particular traditions and understanding of the faith. This class is also appropriate for those who simply want to learn more about the Episcopal church and for lifelong Episcopalians who would like to refresh their understanding. If someone is interested in confirmation or reception and is not able to attend on the 24th, he or she should contact me, and we will make alternative arrangements.

The tagline of the Episcopal Church is "The Episcopal Church Welcomes You." We are not an exclusive club but an inclusive gathering of the followers of Jesus. As I say at the offertory each Sunday: "all are welcome at the table of the Lord."
