As many of you know, cycling is important for me. It is good exercise and a prime opportunity to see the beautiful world of nature. Every year I look forward to my rides in the mountains where I have encountered everything from butterflies to bears. This year, I got something of a wakeup call. Somehow or another, the gradients of the mountain roads I have ridden for years have become steeper. Climbs that I used to handle easily have become much harder. In fact, I chickened out on riding longer climbs that I have ridden for years.
